STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Acquisition of Land by Conservation Commissions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 3851, amended. The 7th sentence of section 3851 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 203 of the public laws of 1965 and as amended by section 4 of chapter 394 of the public laws of 1969, is further amended to read as follows:

A Conservation Commission may acquire land in the name of the municipality for any of the purposes set forth in this section **with the consent of the municipal officers.**

STATEMENT OF FACT

The amendment would allow municipal officers of a town to give their consent before a conservation commission of that town could acquire or receive a parcel of land in the town's name.
