AN ACT Relating to **Compensation for Full-time Deputy Sheriffs and Chief Deputies of Penobscot County.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 958, amended. The last sentence of section 958 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

Such full-time deputy sheriffs shall not receive more than \$112 and chief deputies shall not receive more than \$119 in the aggregate for any one week, except that these limitations shall not apply to Androscoggin County, Cumberland County, **Penobscot County** and York County.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to remove full-time and chief deputy sheriffs of Penobscot County from the statutory limits for their compensations.
