**AN ACT to Authorize Municipalities to Provide Higher Penalties for
Ordinance Violations.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 2151, amended. The first sentence of the next to the last paragraph of § 2151 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The municipality shall provide a penalty of not more than ~~\$100~~ \$1,000 plus costs for the violation of any ordinance authorized by this section.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act is intended to authorize municipalities to provide for the assessment of fines up to \$1,000 for violations of ordinances. The present maximum penalty that may be established in an ordinance is \$100.
