**RESOLVE, Appropriating Funds for Flood Control at the Penobscot
Reservation on Indian Island.**

Flood control at Penobscot Reservation on Indian Island. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Indian Affairs the sum of \$45,000 for construction of a dike at the Penobscot Reservation on Indian Island for the purpose of controlling excess water from the Penobscot River at times of high water.

STATEMENT OF FACT

At various times during the year there is an excessive amount of water which is on Indian Island due to high water levels in the Penobscot River which is due to water runoff from lands and man-made obstructions in the Penobscot River.

The total estimated cost is \$43,800 with a contingency of \$1,200 totaling \$45,000 for the entire project.
