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**AN ACT** Relating to Disqualification for Benefits under Employment  
Security Law for Certain Elderly Employees.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 26, § 1193, sub-§ 1, ¶ B, amended.** Paragraph B of subsection 1 of section 1193 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 13 of chapter 381 of the public laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows:

**B.** For the duration of his unemployment period subsequent to his having retired; or having been retired from his regular employment as a result of a recognized employer policy or program, **under which he is entitled to receive pension payments**, if so found by the commission, and disqualification shall continue until claimant has earned **§ 4** times his weekly benefit amount;

STATEMENT OF FACT

This proposal would protect elderly workers subject to involuntary separations from employment establishments who fail to provide a pension program.
