STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Duck Blinds on Penobscot Reservation Lands.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 22, § 4793, additional. Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 4793 to read as follows:

§ 4793. Duck blinds

Any person not a member of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians shall be permitted to construct or occupy a duck blind on Penobscot Reservation lands provided a permit is first secured from the Penobscot tribal clerk specifying the location of such blind and a payment of \$5 is made for each blind so located.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this bill is to enforce compliance with hunting and fishing ordinances of the Penobscot Tribe.
