STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Machines or Mechanism for Amusement or
Entertainment on Liquor Licensed Premises.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 702, amended. Section 702 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new paragraph at the end to read as follows:

All types of machines or mechanism designed for amusement or entertainment may be permitted on licensed premises, except Class A restaurants, provided the licensee forthwith in writing, upon the installation of such equipment, notifies the commission of the fact of such installation, together with a description of the type of machine. The licensee shall be required to furnish such additional information to the commission as the commission in its sole discretion deems necessary for proper supervision of such activity. A filing fee of \$100 shall accompany each notice of installation.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to put into law a rule and regulation of the commission to properly evaluate the worth of these machines.

FISCAL NOTE

It is estimated that this bill will produce \$60,000 to \$75,000 additional revenue per year.
