COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H. P. 788, L. D. 1064, Bill,
"AN ACT Relating to Stating Purposes of Bond Issues Referred to
the People."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the beginning of the first
line after the enacting clause (same in L. D.) the underlined
abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 1.'

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 354."
by striking out the 2nd sentence and inserting in place thereof
the following 2 new sentences:

'The preambles of all bond issues to be voted upon in any given
election shall be printed on an instruction sheet, 2 of which
shall be posted by the warden of each polling place in a con-
spicuous location at or near the entrance of the polling place.
These instruction sheets shall be prepared and distributed by
the office of the Secretary of State in sufficient numbers as
each voting precinct shall require.'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the end the following
section:

'Sec. 2. Appropriation. There shall be appropriated to the
Department of the Secretary of State from the General Fund the
sum of \$1400 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown
shall be as follows:
