AN ACT Providing Funds for the Maine Law Enforcement Planning and Assistance Agency.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Maine Law Enforcement Planning and Assistance Agency the sum of \$303,849 to provide 40% of the nonfederal funding required to assist the courts; including prosecution and defense, corrections including probation and parole, the State Police, and other state law enforcement agencies, in meeting their required cash match. The breakdown shall be as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

Title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, as amended by the Omnibus Crime Control Act of 1970, passed by the Congress and signed by the President requires in an amendment to Part C—Grants for Law Enforcement Purposes—Section 301.C. Effective July 1, 1972, at least 40% of the nonfederal funding of the cost of any program or project to be funded by a grant under this section shall be of money appropriated in the aggregate, by State, for the purpose of the shared funding of such programs or projects.
