STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Appropriating Moneys for Additional General Purpose Education Subsidies to Certain Units for the Fiscal Year 1970-1971.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the total of general purpose subsidies paid to all units during the January-June, 1970 period should be brought up to the level of 100% of what would have been paid in the same period under a continuation of the 1969 basis of apportionment which was the original intention in authorizing the \$22,000,000 bond issue provided through the enactment and ratification of chapter 171 of the private and special laws of 1969; and

Whereas, the units named include those which under the 1970 basis of apportionment suffered an actual reduction from the level paid in 1969 and others which were entitled under the 1970 formula to a moderate increase but were so severely prorated in the January-June 1970 period that their final apportionments as prorated were less than they would have received under the 1969 formula; and

Whereas, prorating was necessary because the 1970 basis of apportionment would have required some \$23,000,000 in payments during the 6-month period whereas only the \$22,000,000 bond proceeds were available; and

Whereas, all other units in the State received more in the January-June 1970 period, even after prorating, than they would have received under a continuation of the 1969 basis of apportionment; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the

following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of of the General Fund the sum of \$1,104,363.67 to the Department of Education to pay to the following municipalities and districts the following additional general purpose education subsidies for the fiscal year 1970-71:
