COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to S. P. 392, L. D. 1170, Bill,
"AN ACT Increasing Salaries of Justices of the Supreme Judicial
Court and the Superior Court and Judges of the District Court."

Amend said Bill in the Title by striking out the words "and Judges of the District Court"

Further amend said Bill in section 1 by striking out in the 5th line (4th line of L. D.) the underlined figure "\$23,750" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '\$22,250'; and by striking out in the 7th line (5th line of L. D.) the underlined figure "\$25,250" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '\$23,750'

Further amend said Bill in section 2 by striking out in the 5th line (same in L. D.) the underlined figure "\$23,500" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '\$22,000'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of section 3.

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of section 4

and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Supreme Judicial and Superior Courts the sum of \$36,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
