COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 396, L. D. 1174, Bill,  
"AN ACT Relating to Notice of Suspension of Motor Vehicle Driving  
Privileges."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the last paragraph  
of section 1 and inserting in place thereof the following:

'The notification of the suspension or revocation of any  
certificate of registration or any license issued to any person  
to operate a motor vehicle shall be sufficient if sent by  
registered or certified mail to the address given by the registrant  
or licensee. The notification of the suspension or revocation of  
any certificate of registration or any license issued to any person  
to operate a motor vehicle shall be sufficient if sent to the  
registrant or licensee to the address given by him by registered  
or certified mail, return receipt requested, with instructions to  
deliver to addressee only. Notification by registered or certified  
mail shall be complete when the registered or certified mail is  
delivered and the return receipt signed. When notification is  
refused or undeliverable for any other reason, notification of the  
suspension or revocation of any certificate of registration or any  
license issued to any person to operate a motor vehicle may be  
served upon such person by the sheriff of the county in which such  
person resides or by any of his deputies. The fee for such service  
shall be that prescribed in Title 30, section 1051, subsection 1.'
