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AN ACT Increasing Salaries of Certain County Officials of Somerset County.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30, § 2, amended. The 14th paragraph of section 2 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes which relates to Somerset County, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

**Somerset County:** County commissioners, \$1,500; chairman, \$1,750; clerk of courts, ~~\$5,750~~ \$6,250; county attorney, \$8,000; assistant county attorney, ~~\$5,000~~ \$6,500; county treasurer, ~~\$2,600~~ \$2,850; sheriff, ~~\$5,750~~ \$6,250; register of deeds, ~~\$5,750~~ \$6,250; judge of probate, ~~\$5,750~~ \$6,250; register of probate, ~~\$5,750~~ \$6,250.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Attorney General the sum of \$3,750 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Sec. 3. Effective date. This Act shall be retroactive to January 1, 1971.
