SENATE AMENDMENT "D" to HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 906,
L.D. 1250, Bill, "AN ACT Establishing a State-wide Open Deer
Season for the First Three Weeks in November."

Amend said Amendment by inserting after the 13th line the following:

'Sec. 2. R. S., T. 12, §2353, amended. Section 2353 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by inserting before the last paragraph a new paragraph to read as follows:

The commissioner is authorized to shorten the open season on deer in any area of the State, providing such termination is made and published prior to September 1st of any year. If in the opinion of the commissioner an immediate emergency action is necessary due to adverse weather conditions or severe hunting pressure, he may terminate the open season on deer at any time in any section of the State.'

Further amend said Amendment in the 14th line by striking out the underlined abbreviation and figure "Sec. 2." and inserting in place thereof the underlined abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 3.'

Further amend said Amendment in the 20th line by striking out the underlined abbreviation and figure "Sec. 3." and inserting in place thereof the underlined abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 4.'
