## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

### AN ACT Increasing Compensation for Members of the State Board of Barbers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 32, § 351, amended. The last paragraph of section 351 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Each members of the board shall be allowed the sum of \$20 \$35 per day and their necessary expenses for actual attendance upon any examination of candidates for registration, and for any necessary hearings and board meetings.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

Members of the Barber's Board are self-employed barbers. This increase in per diem allowance will compensate for loss of income while they are away from their business when performing board duties.
