STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Imposition of Sentence to the State Prison and Men's Correctional Center.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 34, § 1631, sub-§ 4, additional. Section 1631 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 54 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding a new subsection 4 to read as follows:

4. Sentence to State Prison and Men's Correctional Center. The Court may impose a sentence to the State Prison or the Men's Correctional Center, suspend the execution of all or any part of the sentence for not more than 5 years and place the respondent on probation, and such probation shall commence at the time of imposition of sentence.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit a court to suspend all or any part of a sentence to the State Prison or the Men's Correctional Center.
