HOUSE AMENDMENT " A" to S. P. 449, L. D. 1295, Bill, "AN ACT
Relating to Definition of Restaurant under the Liquor Law."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the end, before the Statement
of Fact, the following:

'Sec. 3. R. S., T. 28, §702, amended. The first sentence of
section 702 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read
as follows:

'No licensee for sale of liquor to be consumed on his licensed
premises shall permit, on his licensed premises, any music, except
radio or other mechanical device including movies, any dancing,
movies or entertainment of any sort unless the licensee shall have
first obtained from the commission a special amusement permit for
which he shall pay to the commission a fee of \$10.'

Statement of Fact

It is the intent of this amendment to permit movies to be
shown by on-premise licensees.
