## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 105TH LEGISLATURE

HOUSE AMENDMENT " A" to S. P. 449, L. D. 1295, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Definition of Restaurant under the Liquor Law."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the end, before the Statement of Fact, the following:

'Sec. 3. R. S., T. 28, §702, amended. The first sentence of section 702 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'No licensee for sale of liquor to be consumed on his licensed premises shall permit, on his licensed premises, any music, except radio or other mechanical device <u>including movies</u>, any dancing, <u>movies</u> or entertainment of any sort unless the licensee shall have first obtained from the commission a special amusement permit for which he shall pay to the commission a fee of \$10.'

## Statement of Fact

It is the intent of this amendment to permit movies to be shown by on-premise licensees.
