STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Public Utilities Providing Gas Service and Valves on Their Distribution and Service Lines.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 35, § 142, additional. Title 35 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 142 to read as follows:

§ 142. Valves

Every gas company declared to be a public utility and subject to the jurisdiction, control and regulation of the Public Utilities Commission shall meet the following standards:

- r. Valves. Each distribution system must have valves thereon and such valves shall be spaced so as to reduce the time to shut down a section of main in an emergency. The valve spacing is determined by the operating pressure, the size of the mains and the local physical conditions. Each valve on a main installed for operating or emergency purposes must comply with the following:
 - A. The valve must be placed in a readily accessible location so as to facilitate its operation in an emergency.
 - B. The operating stem or mechanism must be readily accessible.
 - C. If the valve is installed in a buried box or enclosure, the box or enclosure must be installed so as to avoid transmitting external loads to the main.
- 2. Service line. Each service line must have a service-line valve, and each such valve must be located upstream of the regulator, or, if there is no regu-

lator, upstream of the meter. Each service-line valve must be installed in a readily accessible location that, if feasible, is outside of the building. Each underground service-line valve must be located in a covered durable curb box or standpipe that allows ready operation of the valve and is supported independently of the service lines.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require by statute in addition to existing rules and regulations of the Public Utilities Commission, that gas companies, subject to the jurisdiction of the commission, place certain valves on their distribution and service lines.
