STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Prescribing Contraceptive Methods to Minors without Parental Consent.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 32, § 2607, additional. Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2607 to read as follows:

§ 2607. Prescribing contraceptive methods to minors

Any osteopathic physician licensed under this chapter, who in the exercise of due care prescribes a contraceptive method to a minor, is under no obligation to obtain the consent of a parent or guardian, as applicable, or to inform such parent or guardian of such treatment.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 32, § 3155, additional. Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 3155 to read as follows:

§ 3155. Prescribing contraceptive methods to minors

Any physician licensed under this chapter, who in the exercise of due care prescribes a contraceptive method to a minor, is under no obligation to obtain the consent of a parent or guardian, as applicable, or to inform such parent or guardian of such treatment.
