STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Copies of Examinations to Practice Law Given to Applicants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 4, § 805, amended. The first sentence of section 805 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The examination papers shall be kept on file in the office of the secretary of the board for a period of one year, after which time the same may be destroyed and a record kept of each application, the name of the applicant and his qualifications and general standing as ascertained by such examination, and the secretary of the board shall furnish each applicant with a eard copy of his examination showing the proficiency he has attained in each branch or subject upon which he has been examined, whether a certificate of qualification is issued or not.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to give to the applicants for admission to practice law a copy of his examination to better inform him of his proficiency he has attained in each branch of the examination.
