**AN ACT Relating to Compensation for Minors Delivering Newspaper
Supplements.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 772, amended. Section 772 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new paragraph at the end to read as follows:

No person, firm or corporation or their agent shall employ any person under 18 years of age for the purpose of delivering newspapers containing supplements or inserts unless such minor persons are compensated 1¢ per supplement above their normal rate.

STATEMENT OF FACT

As newspaper supplements and inserts have become an increasingly popular means of advertising and the newspapers are receiving extra compensation for it, it is the intent of this legislation to more adequately compensate delivery boys who are carrying the extra load.
