**AN ACT to Provide for the Taxation of Pulpwood and Logs
in Place Where Situated.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 36, § 603, sub-§ 2, ¶ A-1, additional. Subsection 2 of section 603 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new paragraph A-1, to read as follows.

A-1. Pulpwood and logs.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide for the taxation of pulpwood and logs where located. Pulpwood and logs located in a place other than the residence of the owner is difficult to assess because the assessors of the place of residence of the owner have no way of independently discovering the existence of said pulpwood and logs.
