IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Appropriate Money for Repairs to Existing School Buildings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. In addition to any state appropriation for the support of schools, there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Education the sum of \$2,350,000 to aid school administrative units in the necessary repairs of school buildings. Each administrative unit shall receive up to 5% of its general purpose subsidy that it received in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1970, provided such administrative unit raises and appropriates 40% of the funds necessary for such repairs and provided such repairs are approved by the Department of Education.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide funds for administrative units to aid them in keeping existing school buildings in repairs.
