STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Extend Period When Incapacity Results under Occupational Disease Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 39, § 189, amended. The last sentence of section 189 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 5 of chapter 374 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

Compensation shall not be payable for incapacity by reason of occupational diseases unless such incapacity results within 23 years after the last injurious exposure to such disease in the employment.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to extend period when incapacity results from 2 to 3 years.
