SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to H. P. 1027, L. D. 1422, Bill,
"AN ACT Revising the Implied Consent Law for Operators of Motor
Vehicles."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 1312." by striking out all of paragraph B of subsection 10, which reads as follows:

"B. Any officer authorized to arrest for violations of this section may arrest, without a warrant, any person involved in a motor vehicle accident, if the officer has probable cause to believe that such person has violated this section."

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 1312." by relettering paragraphs C and D to be paragraphs B and C.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is:

- 1. To protect the citizenry from "arrest without warrant" in misdemeanor cases unless the alleged misdemeanor is committed in the presence of the law enforcement officer.
- 2. To protect law enforcement officers from suits for civil damages for false arrest.
