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**AN ACT to Correct Inconsistencies in the Town Election Law.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30, § 2061, sub-§ 3, ¶ C, amended.** The first sentence of paragraph C of subsection 3 of section 2061 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

A certificate of political caucus nomination and a nomination paper which conforms with this section is valid unless a written objection to it is made to the selectmen on or before the ~~12th~~ 19th day next prior to the day of election.

**Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 2067, amended.** The first sentence of section 2067 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 135 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

When any town accepts this section at a meeting held at least ~~30~~ 60 days before the annual meeting, the following provisions apply to the nomination of all town officials required by section 2055 to be elected by ballot.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make the above sections consistent with the changes that were made by chapter 114 of the public laws of 1969.
