AN ACT Relating to Sale of Marine Worms.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4301-B-1, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 4301-B-1 to read as follows:

§ 4301-B-1. **Weight**

It is unlawful for the holder of a marine worm digger's license to dig or the holder of a marine worm dealer's license to sell any lot of 250 marine worms, the drained weight of which is less than one pound, 14 ounces, up to 24 hours after the digging of such bloodworms or 24 hours after the time of low water in any given day. The holder of a marine worm dealer's license shall be allowed a 10% shrinkage allowance on marine worms held for over 8 hours.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to regulate the weight of marine worms dug or sold.
