COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H. P. 1075, L. D. 1467, Bill,
"AN ACT to Clarify the Law Relating to Nonvoters Speaking at
Town Meetings."

Amend said Bill in the 6th line (4th and 5th lines of L. D.)
by striking out the underlined words "unanimous consent" and
inserting in place thereof the underlined words 'consent of 2/3'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to require a person not a
voter in a town to speak at a town meeting with only a consent
of 2/3 of the voters present rather than having a unanimous
consent.
