## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Clarify the Law Relating to Nonvoters Speaking at Town Meetings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 2054, sub-§ 3, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 3 of section 2054 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding after the first sentence a new sentence to read as follows:

A person not a voter in the town may speak at the meeting only with unanimous consent of the voters present.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill is intended to clarify the law with respect to nonvoters speaking at town meetings. Presently the statutes do not give a moderator any guidance in determining whether a nonvoter of the town may be allowed to speak.
