SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to S. P. 532, L. D. 1568, Bill, "AN ACT
Relating to Criminal Trespass in Buildings and on Premises."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the end, before the period,
of paragraph A of subsection 1 of that part designated "§3854."
the following: 'but shall not include any publicly owned buildings'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of subsection 3 of
that part designated "§3854." and inserting in place thereof the
following:

'3. Refusal to vacate. Whoever refuses or fails to leave
the premises of a private degree-granting educational institution
during those hours of the day or night when the premises are regularly
closed, upon being requested to do so by a guard, watchman or custodian
employed by said institution, if the circumstances are such as to
indicate to a reasonable man that such person has no apparent lawful
business to pursue, shall be punished as provided in subsection 2.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of the amendment is to have the bill apply to
privately owned buildings.
