**AN ACT Relating to Suspension of Motor Vehicle Operator's License for  
Speeding Violation.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 224I-A, additional. Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 224I-A to read as follows:

§ 224I-A. —Speeding violations

Any person convicted of a 2nd speeding violation under this Title within a period of one year shall have his license and privilege to operate a motor vehicle in this State suspended for 30 days.

Any person convicted of a 3rd speeding violation within a period of one year shall have his license and privilege to operate a motor vehicle in this State suspended for 60 days.

Any person convicted of a subsequent speeding violation shall not be licensed again or permitted to operate a motor vehicle in this State indefinitely, except that 6 months from the date of such suspension, he may petition the Secretary of State for a restoration of his license or permit and after hearing, the Secretary of State may issue a license or permit to the petitioner, with or without conditions and restrictions and under such terms as he may deem equitable, having in mind the petitioner's previous record, the safety of the public and the welfare of the petitioner and his immediate dependents.

The license and privilege to operate motor vehicles of any person convicted as provided in this section shall be suspended by the Secretary of State upon receipt of an attested copy of the court record, without further hearing.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide for a suspension of a person's license to operate a motor vehicle after conviction of speeding violations.
