SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1361, L. D. 1776, RESOLVE, Providing Minimum Retirement Benefits for Certain Teachers.

Amend said Resolve by striking out at the beginning of the Title the word "RESOLVE" and inserting in place thereof the words "AN ACT"

Further amend said Resolve in the last line of the emergency preamble by striking out the words "be it"

Further amend said Resolve by inserting at the end of the emergency preamble the following:

'Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:'

after the emergency preamble by striking out the words "Resolved:

That the following-named former teachers" and inserting in place

thereof the words 'The following-named former teachers shall'

Further amend said Resolve in the 19th line of the 5th paragraph (18th in L. D.) by striking out the following:

"Evelyn Roberts Boothby, 8 Norwood Street, Portland, Maine"

Further amend said Resolve in the 27th line of the 5th paragraph (26th in L. D.) by striking out the following:

"Frances Hurley Duffy, 29 Union Street, Ellsworth, Maine"

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the 2nd paragraph from the end and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Maine State Retirement System the sum of \$27,840 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972 and \$26,030 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973 to carry out the purposes of this Act.'
