HOUSE AMENDMENT "A " to H. P. 1371, L. D. 1789, Bill,
"AN ACT Relating to Hunting, Fishing and Trapping on Indian
Tribal Lands."

Amend said Bill by striking out everything after the enacting
clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 2401-B, sub-§ 7, ¶ A, amended. The
first sentence of the 2nd paragraph of paragraph A of subsection 7
of section 2401-B of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted
by chapter 409 of the public laws of 1971, is amended to read as
follows:

After having had full consultation with and the consent of the
Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game, the tribal governor and
council of each reservation shall have the right to govern by
tribal ordinance hunting, fishing and trapping ~~by-Indians~~ on
their respective reservation lands.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall take effect January 2,
1972.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to regulate hunting by
other than Indians on Indian tribal lands.
