STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-TWO

RESOLVE, to Reimburse School Administrative District #37 for Funds Paid for School Construction in 1965 and 1966.

School Administrative District #37. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$9,350 to reimburse School Administrative District #37 for state's share of school construction which was not paid in 1965 and 1966 on a Maine School Building Authority project prior to formation of the district.

STATEMENT OF FACT

School Administrative District #37 was organized on December 30, 1964, and all payments made on school construction projects after that date were eligible for school construction aid provided that plans were approved after August 28, 1957, or the town had voted after that date to incur an obligation with the Maine School Building Authority. The Town of Milbridge voted prior to August 28, 1957, to construct a school building using Maine School Building Authority financing. The building was completed subsequent to August 28, 1957. School Administrative District #37 paid in principal and interest \$8,600 in 1965 and \$8,400 in 1966 on this project which was not reimbursed under the school construction aid provision of the law. The district, at that time, was eligible for 55% construction aid. If aid had been paid, \$4,730 would have been reimbursed in 1965. The total reimbursement would have been \$9,350.
