STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-TWO

AN ACT Providing Funds for the Maine Law Enforcement Planning and Assistance Agency.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1971, c. 139, amended. Chapter 139 of the private and special laws of 1971 is amended to read as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Maine Law Enforcement Planning and Assistance Agency the sum of \$92,843 \$142,843 to provide part of the nonfederal funding required to assist state, municipal and county law enforcement agencies in meeting their required match. The breakdown shall be as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

The 105th Legislature in regular session by chapter 139 of the private and special laws of 1971 appropriated \$92,843 to the Maine Law Enforcement Planning and Assistance Agency for local law enforcement programs which are federally assisted. The Federal Law Enforcement Assistance Administration has revised upwards the amount of money for Maine to assist such law enforcement programs. An appropriation of an additional \$50,000 in state funds will generate about \$1,000,000 in federal funds.
