STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-TWO

AN ACT Relating to Use of Artificial Lights for Lighting Game.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2465, amended. Section 2465 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as last amended by chapter 28 of the public laws of 1969, is further amended to read as follows:

§ 2465. Use of artificial lights for lighting game

The use of artificial lights between ½ hour after sunset and ½ hour before sunrise to illuminate, jack, locate, attempt to locate or show up wild birds or wild animals shall be unlawful during any open season on deer from September 15th of each calendar year, except as provided in section 2354, and section 2358, subsection 4.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to change the time when the use of artificial lights for lighting game is illegal.
