**AN ACT** Relating to Number of Corporators of Oak Grove School.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. & S. L., 1939, c. 123, § 1, amended.** Section 1 of chapter 123 of the private and special laws of 1939 is amended to read as follows:

**Sec. 1. Oak Grove school incorporated.** George Loring Crosman, William T. Hussey, Lindley M. Binford, Arthur Jones, Harry Harrison, their associates, successors, and assigns are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of Oak Grove school, and by this name may sue and be sued, have a common seal, make such bylaws as they may deem expedient for the management of their affairs, fill all vacancies occurring in their number, increase their number if they see fit ~~to not exceeding 15~~ and may take and hold any estate, real or personal, that they may now possess or may hereafter receive by donation or otherwise; and the corporation aforesaid is hereby invested with all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to repeal the limit of the number of corporators of Oak Grove School so that the school may be better able to carry out its duties and functions.
