RESOLVE, in Favor of Robert D. Lust for Automobile Damage.

Robert D. Lust; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$79.93 to be paid to Robert D. Lust of Merrick, New York, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for damage to his motor vehicle caused by the failure to remove a boulder on a portion of Route 2 being constructed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

On October 1, 1971 Mr. Lust was travelling west on Route 2 a few miles east of Dixfield. The road was being constructed and a truck was clearing boulders from the area. Traffic was being directed by a flagman who limited the flow of traffic to one direction at a time. The flagman waved Mr. Lust through and his motor vehicle ran over a boulder which had not been cleared from the road.
