## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-TWO

#### AN ACT Increasing Borrowing Capacity of York Sewer District.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, adequate public sewerage is vital to the health and well-being of the inhabitants of the Town of York; and

Whereas, an increase in the borrowing capacity of the York Sewer District is essential in order to expand the district and thus abate the pollution of the beaches and recreational waters of the Town of York; and

Whereas, such abatement should be commenced as soon as possible in the spring of 1972 for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Town of York; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1951, c. 63, § 16, amended. The first sentence of section 16 of chapter 63 of the private and special laws of 1951, as last amended by section 3 of chapter 63 of the private and special laws of 1967, is further amended to read as follows:

For accomplishing the purposes of this Act, said district, by resolution of its board of trustees, is hereby authorized to borrow money temporarily

and to issue therefor its negotiable notes, and for the purpose of refunding the indebtedness so created, of paying any necessary expenses and liabilities incurred under the provisions of this Act, including organizational and other necessary expenses and liabilities; and in acquiring properties, paying damages, laying sewers, drains and conduits, constructing, maintaining and operating a sewage plant or system and making renewals, extensions, additions, extensions and improvements to the same, and to cover interest payments during the period of construction, said York Sewer District, by resolution of its board of trustees, is also hereby authorized to issue, from time to time, bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness of the district in one series, or in separate series, in an amount or amounts at such rates of interest and on such terms and conditions as the trustees shall determine; provided, however, that the total outstanding indebtedness of said district shall at no time exceed the sum of \$\frac{\partial \text{F}\_1,000,000}{\partial \text{P}\_2,000,000}.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is reflected in the emergency preamble.
