#### SENATE 105TH LEGISLATURE FIRST SPECIAL SESSION

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1504, L. D. 1946, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Housing and Food Supplies Furnished by State Departments."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the first paragraph after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'R.S., T. 5, §§ 8-A - 8-G, additional. Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding 7 new sections, 8-A to 8-G, to read as follows:'

Further amend said Bill in the 5th and 6th lines (5th line of L.D.) in that part designated "§ 8-D"by striking out the underlined words 'undedicated revenue'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of that part designated "§ 8-E." and inserting in place thereof the following:

### '§ 8-E. Domestic service

No employee of the State of Maine shall be assigned to perform routine housekeeping, food preparation or other chores for employees assigned to and living in housing facilities owned by the State of Paine.

This is not intended, however, to prevent bona fide domestic training programs wherein various patients and others in state institutions of Maine are trained for increased employment opportunities.

## § 8-F. Rules and regulations; review

Each department shall establish and promulgate, subject to the approval of the Budget Officer, rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of sections 8-B to 8-C. Such rules and regulations shall be transmitted to the Legislative Research Committee for its review will in 60 days after passage of this Act and thereafter biennially.

Further amend said Bill by renumbering that part designated "§ 8-F." to be '§ 8-G.'

#### Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to prohibit domestic service, retain present distribution of revenue and to specify approval of regulations by the Budget Officer.
