HOUSE AMENDMENT "G " S. P. 768, L. D. 2047, Bill, "AN ACT to Appropriate Moneys for the Expenditures of State Government and Other Purposes for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1972 and June 30, 1973."

Amend said Bill in SECTION A under the caption "HEALTH AND WELFARE" by striking out all of that part relating to "Eye Care and Special Services" and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Eye Care and Special Services

All Other	60,000	90,000

Provides funds to meet additional costs of Special Education Program for blind children and to continue the refractive error program for children.'

Further amend said Bill in SECTION A under the caption "HEALTH AND WELFARE" by striking out all of the last line (last 2 lines in L. D.) and inserting in place thereof the following:

'TOTAL HEALTH AND WELFARE	\$1,662,288	\$4,893,402'

Further amend said Bill in SECTION A by striking out all of the last 3 lines (last 4 lines in L. D.) and inserting in place thereof the following:

'TOTAL APPROPRIATIONS - SECTION A	<u>\$2,011,294</u>	<u>\$7,579,614</u>
-----------------------------------	--------------------	--------------------

Amounting to \$2,011,294 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972 and \$7,579,614 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973.'
