**AN ACT Providing Complimentary Hunting Licenses to Maine Residents
over 70 years of Age.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2401-B, sub-§ 13, amended. The first sentence of subsection 13 of section 2401-B of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 409 of the public laws of 1971, is amended to read as follows:

A complimentary license to hunt or fish shall be issued to any resident of Maine who is over 70 years of age and applies therefor to the ~~Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game~~ **Commissioner**.
