#### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Provide Hospital Administrators under the Department of Mental Health and Corrections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 34, § 2102, amended. The 3rd and 4th sentences of section 2102 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by section 3 of chapter 350 of the public laws of 1971, are amended to read as follows:

The appointment shall be for a term of # years an indeterminate term and until his successor is appointed and qualified, or during the pleasure of the commissioner and the Advisory Committee on Mental Health. The superintendent shall be a qualified psychiatrist, a qualified hospital administrator, a licensed qualified psychologist, or a person with a master's degree in social work, public administration or public health.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 34, § 2151, amended. The 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th sentences of the 2nd paragraph of section 2151 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes as last repealed and replaced by section 4 of chapter 350 of the public laws of 1971, are amended to read as follows:

The commissioner shall, with the advice and consent of the Advisory Committee on Mental Health Maine Committee on Problems of the Mentally Retarded, appoint, and set the salary of the Superintendent of the Pineland Hospital and Training Center. The appointment shall be for a term of a years an indefinite term and until his successor is appointed and qualified, or during the pleasure of the commissioner and the Advisory Committee on Mental Health Maine Committee on Problems of the Mentally Retarded.

The superintendent shall be a qualified psychiatrist, a qualified pediatrician, a qualified hospital administrator, a licensed qualified psychologist, or a person with a master's degree in education, social work, public administration or public health. In making the appointment, the commissioner and the advisory committee Maine Committee on Problems of the Mentally Retarded shall give due consideration to the appointee's qualifications and experience in health matters.
