STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Repealing Certain Exemptions from Weekly Payment of Wages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 623, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 623 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, is repealed as follows:

The provision for weekly payment of wages shall not apply to an employee engaged in cutting and hauling logs and lumber, nor the driving of the same until it reaches its place of destination for sale or manufacture.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to assure weekly payment of wages to a large class of Maine workmen.
