

## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 106TH LEGISLATURE

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A " to H. P. 50, L. D. 57, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to the Wearing of Fluorescent Orange Clothing While Hunting During Hunting Season."

Amend said bill by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'§2468. Fluorescent clothing and color blindness

1. Fluorescent clothing. Any person while hunting with firearms during the open firearm season on deer, except when hunting waterfowl from a boat or blind or in conjunction with waterfowl decoys, shall wear hunter fluorescent orange clothing which is in good and serviceable condition and which shall be visible from all sides.

2. Color blindness. No license to hunt shall be issued to any person who is totally color blind. Each applicant for a hunting license shall be required to state under oath whether or not he is totally color blind. The commissioner shall take proper measures to ensure enforcement of this prohibition.'

## Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to further increase the safety of hunters by requiring not only that hunters wear a distinctive color but also that they be able to recognize colors.
