STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Wearing of Fluorescent Orange Clothing While Hunting During Hunting Season.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2468, repealed and replaced. Section 2468 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by chapter 226 of the public laws of 1969 and as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 2468 Fluorescent clothing

Any person while hunting during any hunting season, except when hunting waterfowl from a boat or blind, shall wear hunter fluorescent orange clothing which is in good and serviceable condition and which shall be visible from all sides.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase the safety of hunters.
