**AN ACT to Change the Name of Gammon Pond, York County, to
Perry Pond.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Gammon Pond; name change. The name of Gammon Pond in the Town
of Newfield, York County, is changed to Perry Pond.

STATEMENT OF FACT

On the westerly side of the Old Limerick Road sometimes called the "back
road" about one mile northerly of Newfield village, there is an 8-acre pond
locally known as Gammon Pond, but having no official name on the Newfield
Quadrangle of the U.S.G.S. topographical maps.

This pond is part of a 50-acre tract of land purchased by Mrs. Hilda Perry
and is being held as a wildlife sanctuary in memory of her late husband, Carl
Perry, former selectman of Newfield.

Pine planting and pruning practices have been carried out and hunting is
being restricted to encourage waterfowl and wildlife in general to flourish in
the area.

Mrs. Perry is arranging for perpetual protection of the area and would like
to have the pond named "Perry Pond" in her husband's memory.
