STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Possession of Salmon, Trout, Togue or Black Bass.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2553, amended. The first sentence of the 4th paragraph from the end of section 2553 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

No person shall have in his possession any salmon, trout, togue or black bass with the heads and tails, or either, detached therefrom, unless such fish are being prepared for ~~immediate~~ cooking, **unless the dressed length is equal to the legal length.**

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that the fish may be kept if the dressed length is equal to the legal length.
