AN ACT Regulating the Use of Power Boats on Upper Lead
Mountain Pond and Alligator Lake, Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 38, § 248, additional. Title 38 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 248 to read as follows:

§ 248.—Upper Lead Mountain Pond and Alligator Lake; use of power boats

No person, except officers empowered to enforce this subchapter, shall operate a motorboat having more than 10 horsepower on Upper Lead Mountain Pond and Alligator Lake, both in Hancock County.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act would be a deterrent to pollution and also a safety measure.
